Hello My Fellow Moose Members!

We're sorry about getting this to you a little later than usual, but we had some big news come out of convention that I didn't want to wait to share! First, the new Mooseheart Fundraising Campaign: 'Uniting Hearts, Expanding Horizons' was announced. This three-year, \$12 million campaign is multifaceted:

- Fully renovate 3 existing homes to serve children and adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities
- Build three brand-new purpose-built homes- Community Integrated Living Arrangements (CILAs) that offer independence with dignity.
- A state-of-the-art Fresh Water Treatment Plant
 – ensuring safety and sustainability for the entire Mooseheart Community.
- Renovation of ten Family Teacher Quarters of homes, the heart of our caregiving model.
- Critical infostructure upgrades

 including new paving, curbs, sidewalks and modernized water lines across key areas of our campus.
- A revitalized track and discus cage, because every child deserves a place to run, compete and dream.

Also coming out of convention were some amendments to the general laws. The one that will probably most affect our membership is: In Sec. 50.2, removes the spouse of member as an indefinite qualified guest. New language would specify that all qualified family members, over the age of 21, shall be considered a prospective member and limited to two visits before making application for membership.

At the original time this rules was written, women could not be members of the lodge and were therefore, always to be escorted by a male member, most typically their husband, now that women can become members, the general law has become outdated. This general law change, along with the other changes/ amendments will come into effect on August 1, 2025.

I just want to give a big thank you to all of those members that volunteered during the International Convention to make our guests feel so welcomed! It was the first thing that people mentioned to me when I said I was from the Kenosha Lodge! Thank you all.
